

## Travel information

Baltic Biogas Bus event & partner meeting, Västerås, Sweden, Dec 12-13<sup>th</sup> 2013

### How to get to Västerås from Arlanda Airport

- **Swebus Airport Coach:** the bus starts at Arlanda terminal 5 (international flights), but also stops at terminals 2, 3 & 4. Approx. travel time to Västerås bus/train station is 1 hr 30 mins. The price is approx. € 23 (without rebooking or cancellation insurance). Please note that the ticket must be purchased in advanced!

- **Train (via Stockholm Central Station):** Arlanda Express train to Stockholm, change to regional train from Stockholm to Västerås. Approx travel time is 1 hr 45 mins. The price may vary, but is approx. € 40 if the ticket is booked well in advanced (without rebooking or cancellation insurance). This alternative is not recommended.
- **Taxi:** Approx. travel time is 1 hr 15 mins. The price is approx. € 140 (if you get a fixed price). This alternative is not recommended.
